SMRWA Launches Oyster Aquaculture Float Tax Rebate Partnership



As many of you already know, Maryland provides an income tax credit of \$500 to every taxpayer (\$1,000 for joint filers) to offset the cost of equipment to grow oysters in floats. The only part of the investment that is not covered is the sales tax. In order for land-locked homeowners to take advantage of this tax credit, we are launching a partnership program where folks can use the tax credit program to benefit from the oyster's wonderful filtering abilities. Floats are kept at partner host docks for 2 years and then the oysters are given to charity.

Join the partnership and put your tax credits into action cleaning our waterways.

3rd Annual River Cleanup Nets Canoe Loads of Trash

Seventeen volunteers paddled the St. Mary's River Water Trail on a cloudy morning last month pulling 12 tires, 20 bags of trash and recyclables, and 500 lbs of loose trash from a chilly St. Mary's River between Great Mills Canoe & Kayak Launch and the end of Atkins Road.

In addition to the tires, volunteers found dozens of beverage containers, approximately 50 plastic bags, children's toys, several metal barrels, a suitcase, a realtor's open house banner, a propane canister, two car steering wheels, and three trash cans. People are always surprised at the things we find in the river. (Mark your calendar—2nd Saturday in April)

Marylanders Grow Oysters Cage Collection and Spat Planting

In the St. Mary's River system, Creek Captains will be contacting you later this month to arrange for collection of your cages. Please take a few extra minutes to clean them up with a vigorous dunking or a hose if you have one on your dock. If the oysters are sticking to the sides or bottom of the cage, please knock them loose by rubbing the sole of your boot on the cage. Dropping the cages on the dock might work well too.

If you are remote from the St. Mary's (i.e. Clement's Bay, Breton Bay, Smith Creek, etc.), please contact Bob Lewis at 301-862-3517 or BobLewis@StMarysRiver.org and make arrangements to drop off your cages at the college pier.


